We talked about when the people who work at night sleep and several of the students talked about the jobs that their grown-ups do. In Maths we have been using our speedy eyes to subitise and talk if the spots they see are equal to, more than or less than three. In mathematics we have been looking at one more and one less. We have thought about how we can use different resources to prove and check our answers.

Seacole Class:





We have had a lovely week in Seacole Class! In Maths, we have been focusing on how we can show ten more or ten less through addition and subtraction equations. We identified a pattern that when we add or subtract the ones stay the same and the tens change. To support our understanding we looked at different representations such as part-whole models and bar models. In English, we have continued to develop our writing through introducing apostrophes for possession, expanded noun phrases and using the conjunction 'and'. We have been describing the dragon's character and physical abilities as well as making sure to include these features in our writing. For our curriculum lessons this week, we started to think about the different shapes and structures we might see when creating our own 1666 or modern day house. We first got out a range of 3D shapes, explored their names and made predictions on what shapes we are most likely to see. As a class, we then went on a walk around the school with our 3D shapes to see which ones we could find. It was amazing to see how creative all the children were being when looking at the different aspects of a building and how they can be made up of more than one shape. Once back in class, we then stuck in a picture of a 1666 house and a modern day house to annotate the different shapes we could see before deciding which one we saw more regularly and which shapes we will see in our houses when constructing them. Well done for a positive week Year 2!

Star Reader - Daisy for reading her phonics book fluently during her phonics lesson.


Chawla Class:

In Maths, we have been placing three-digit numbers on a number line by looking at the previous and next multiples of 100. In our wider curriculum lessons, we have been ordering the process of fossilisation, before exploring the placement of the Stone Age on our historical timelines.
