
What's next ...

In Maths this week, we have been learning how to create an AB pattern and the children have been using two colours to create their pattern. Kandinsky Class:



Seacole class have had a brilliant week! In Maths, we have moved onto looking at how we can add 2 two-digit numbers. We have been applying the strategy of partitioning into ours tens and ones to support our understanding. In English, our new unit is to create a fact file about Queen Elizabeth. For our modelled example, we have been looking at a fact file of King Charles as well as practicing many skills. We have been using capital letters and full stops accurately as well as exploring how we can write in the past tense, using the suffix -ed. For our Wider Curriculum lessons this week, we have been exploring in more depth about Iconic British figures as well as looking at the work of Roy Lichtenstein. For our first lesson, we developed our ideas for our subject matter for our final pieces. We created a mood board of Iconically British figures and elements before choosing our own subject matter. For our second lesson, we explored the work and style of Roy Lichtenstein and began to experiment with our own ideas. We started with a gallery work, exploring the elements of his art before then attempting our own. We have continued to show our artistic skills and develop our understanding of Pop Art!
