#### Darwin Class:

This week our learning question has been, 'What is a community?'. We have been talking about our community and who might help us in the community. The children talked about going to the doctors and visiting the hospital, we talked about why we might see the doctor or go to the hospital.

In maths this week we have been learning about the number 1, we watched Number Blocks 1. We then played a game where the children had to find a picture showing 1. In our phonics learning this week we have been listening to different sounds inside and outside. We look forward to our walk around the community on Monday. We hope you all have a great weekend.

#### Nightingale Class:

This week in Reception we have been continuing our Maths learning work in patterns, thinking about what would come next in a pattern and what the repeating unit of a pattern is and how we can recognise them. We then used the enhanced provision resources to have a go at making our own patterns. We have also been thinking about reviewing our comparisons of sets of items, using vocabulary such as 'more than', 'less than' and 'equal' to think about the quantity of items in different groups. In both our STEAM and Literacy learning we have been talking about the wide world of jobs; what jobs are and why people do jobs. We read a book that talked about lots and lots of different jobs and spent some time thinking about what jobs the children would like to do in the future, drawing and writing the first sound of the job in their workbooks. In STEAM we also talked about the jobs that people on our community do, and which jobs that people do help us, and how they help us. We have also been thinking about safety this week as we introduced helmets to our bikes outside and have talked about turn taking and sharing so that everyone gets a turn. #### Kandinsky Class:

We have had a lovely week in Kandinsky class. In Maths, we have been exploring the different ways we can partition a number. We have retrieved our understanding of part-part-whole models and introduced how we show this using a bar model. In Writing, we have continued to describe the different settings in 'The Storm Whale'. We have been using a range of 'what' and 'what like' words alongside becoming artists and creating the different settings using paint. For our STEAM lesson this week, we explored how our local area has changed over time. We looked at different pictures of Banbury, some that are new and some that are old, and compared them. We then described what we could see that is the same such as buildings and what has changed such as cars, roads and shops.

#### Seacole Class:

This week in Year2 the children have enjoyed learning about the Great Fire of London. They made comparisons between London in 1666 and London today. In maths, the children have been using their number bonds to 10 to add and subtract two digit numbers. In English, the children have been describing a dragon using expanded noun phrases. Today, the children came into school with a spotty accessory and had lots of fun dancing along to music to raise money.

In Year 3 we have had another fantastic week. We have continued our learning in STEAM surrounding our topic 'The Stone Age'. In one lesson we learnt a key word - organic matter- and used our understanding of it to be able to explain what is soil made up of. We then put soil on our desks and created observed drawings, labelling the key features that we could see. In our second STEAM lesson, we learnt about 3 different types of rocks and how they were made. These were igneous, sedimentary, and metamorphic rocks. In Writing, we have focused on developing our descriptive language, in connection to the Stone Age, then we used this learning to help us plan our writing in future lessons. We have also looked at how we can organise our ideas, and created drama pieces based on our paragraph headings. In Reading we have continued our story 'The Pebble in my Pocket', and we related the story to our learning of homophones and prefix's. In Mathematics this week, we have used partitioning to help us solve addition sums, as well as learn a new method which could help us solve addition sums for three-digit questions more easily. I am looking forward to another amazing week!

#### . Ramanujan Class:

This week, we have been writing a shared write narrative based on the story of Hansel and Gretel. The children have explored how to use a range of adjectival phrases and speech, including punctuating them correctly. In Maths, we have begun exploring regular polygons and perimeter. We explored how to measure the perimeter of shapes and identified whether different shapes can have the same perimeter. In STEAM, the children have researched Boudicca and Nero, identifying whether they were good or bad. In outdoor PE, we have been exploring how to hold a hockey stick correctly and how to dribble a ball effectively.
