Nightingale Class:

We've had a fab first week back in Reception. In our STEAM learning this week we have been thinking about the different celebrations that take place at this time of year, Diwali and Bonfire Night. We have been thinking about why these events take place, how they are celebrated and how they might look different between the children. We thought about the kind of things we would see at Bonfire Night and used our phonics sounds to draw and label a picture of something we might see. We even had a pretend Bonfire in the garden and thought about the ways in which we need to be safe when celebrating. In PSED this week we have been reviewing our classroom expectations as we work through the new year. In Maths this week we have been looking at spotting errors in a pattern and continued making patterns in our free flow learning. We have also been thinking about the number 5, singing the song 5 Little Peas. We have also been noticing the spots on a dice and thinking about the number 5 looks like on die frame. Kandinsky Class:

Year 1 have had a wonderful first week back! In Maths, we have been exploring our number bonds to 5 using part-part-whole models and counters. We used the part-part-whole models to partition the number 5 and used the counters to play the 'Drop 5' game which we really enjoyed! In English, we introduced our new text 'The Storm Whale'. Our focus for this unit is on setting descriptions, exploring our 'what' and 'what like' words to describe the different settings in the book. For our first week of STEAM, we introduced our big question 'Which structure is significant to our local area and why?' For our first lesson, we looked at where we live in the UK. We identified the key features of a location in order to say if it is a town, city or village. We then looked at our local area on a simplified map of the county. For our second lesson, we looked at how specific vocabulary can help us navigate. We used directional and locational language such as left, right, forward, backwards, near to and past to walk ourselves round the playground and field. Before this, we directed our small world figurines around an aerial map of William Morris.

Seacole Class:

Year 2 have had an excellent start to Term 2. In English, we have started a new unit and are looking at the story 'Tell Me a Dragon'. The children really enjoyed looking at the different dragons in the story and finding out about their different physical abilities. In Maths, the children have been looking one more and one less for numbers between 20-100. In HRE the children have been looking at the human body and learning about how people change as they get older. In STEAM this term the children will be learning about The Great Fire of London. This week the children learnt where the fire started, how it spread and how the fire was put out.

In Year 3, we have had a fantastic first week back! We are very excited and looking forward to our new STEAM topic - 'The Stone Age'. In our first lesson this week, we have looked at various types of rocks and created observational drawing of these. From this we explored many different items that the Stone Age people created from rock, and what qualities they needed to include. In Writing, our new class story links perfectly to out STEAM topic, with the title being 'Stone Age Boy'. We used the illustrations at the beginning of the book to understand more about life in the Stone Age time. We have also looked at time adverbials and place adverbials this week, and started to include these into our sentences. In Reading lessons, we have come to the end of our Story 'Leon and the place between', we very much enjoyed discussing and learning new vocabulary surrounding magic. We have also been practicing the skill of inferring using evidence in a text, making suggestions as to what has been implied. In Mathematics we have been practicing adding and subtracting from a three-digit number, to do this we used our number bonds to ten and practiced counting up and down in 10s.


Star Reader - Lily for her excellent reading in class this week, and sharing her joy of reading with others.




Ramanujan Class:

What a great week in Year 4! In Maths this week, we have been investigators and looked at different methods of subtracting. We have done this by using 4 digit numbers and a focus on regrouping. In writing, we have looked at the story of Hansel and Gretel from the perspective of Gretel. We have used our box plans to help us map out and remember the order of the story, while we also focused on using adverbials to add detail about the time and place. Finally, in STEAM we have started our learning journey by looking at the Romans and the impact they had on modern life. We have discussed as a class the leader Julius Caesar and the different battle formations the Roman's used (including the 'Testudo' formation which translates as the word turtle).

In maths the children have started to look at negative numbers and have been learning to read them on horizontal and vertical axis. In STEAM the children were very excited to discover they will be looking at the Ancient Egyptians this term – we had a very wet first lesson as the children pretended to be Egyptians and tried to move huge amounts of water across the playground. As always, it is a joy and privilege to work in the class and I look forward to having them again soon for more lessons!
