#### **Darwin Class:**

Our learning question this week was 'Who can be an artist?'. We started our investigating by learning what being an artist means and we studied pictures of different types of art such as paintings, drawings and sculptures. We also took a virtual tour of an Art Gallery to see where some art lives. Mrs Perry visited the Tate Modern in London last week and took lots of pictures of different types of art to show us. We then revisited our learning question and talked about how we are all artists even when we are just making marks on our paper. To develop our own art skills we have been using a range of different tools to create art, we learnt that we can paint using lots of objects, not just a paint brush. We worked together to make a group painting where we used cars, Lego, toilet rolls and our hands to create a picture.

In maths this week we have been learning about the number 5, we watched number blocks 5 and have been singing lots of different numbers songs such as 5 men little men. We hope you all have a great weekend.

### Nightingale Class:

It has been a lovely sunny week in Reception. In STEAM this week we have been thinking about our new topic of Art, and having fun exploring different mediums and tools. We have been painting with brushes, balloons and toy cars to name a few. We read the story "The Dot" and created our own dot masterpiece with pencils. We then used our dot pictures to inspire our Literacy and wrote a description of our dot. In Maths we have been thinking about how 2D shapes are similar and different and what clues we can use to decide what kind of shape it is. We have also been thinking about how we order numbers up to 8, using the staircase pattern with the numberblocks to think what is one more than the number before. In PSED we talked about feeling in the "yellow zone", i.e. nervous, bubbly and a bit over excited. We read a story about how important it is to talk to someone if we are not feeling like ourselves and what things we can do to make ourselves feel better. We have also using "less than" to describe numbers which are smaller than others. We enjoyed celebrating World Book Day, reading stories with the Year 6's and wearing our fabulous costumes. #### Kandinsky Class:

We have had a brilliant week in Kandinsky class! In Maths, we have been exploring what happens to a number when we add 0 and what happens if the number is the same as itself. We have continued to use counters to support our understanding and applied our knowledge to a range of equations. In Writing, we drafted our retelling of the Three Little Pigs making sure to include key skills we have learnt this term and then published them in our neatest handwriting! We were all very proud of our stories. For our STEAM learning this week, we looked at what all plants have in common and decided if all plants are the same using support or challenge. For our first lesson, we explored the common features of a plant structure. We first used our magnifying glasses to observe them before dissecting and annotating them in our design books. For our second lesson this week, we used our knowledge of the features of plants to observe and sort them into categories. We first explored these in real life before sticking pictures into a Venn diagram. To top of our week, we had World Book Day! It was amazing to see so many amazing costumes and here the children being so passionate about books. Reading is an adventure that never ends!

In Year 3, we have had a fantastic week continuing our STEAM learning around 'The Tudors'. We will be making shadow puppets later on this term, so this week we have carried out investigations as to whether translucent, transparent, or opaque materials support us to make effective shadows. We also explored how the light source has to direct its light at an opaque material in order for a shadow to be created. We used our fingers to create finger puppet shadows using a torch. In Writing, we have focused on the vocabulary we need to include in our setting descriptions about a storm. These were subordinating conjunctions, past tense verbs, and adverbials of place and time. In Mathematics, we have started our new topic, column subtraction, and practiced drawing it's layout in our books. We then have completed subtraction equations using this method. In Reading, we have continued our class story ' Sam Wu is NOT afraid of the DARK', we have made inferences based on evidence in the text. We have had an excellent week and really enjoyed our Library visit for World Book Day!

Our STEAM learning has taken us to Ancient Baghdad, where we have researched the House of Wisdom. The children were fascinated by this remarkable centre of learning, where scholars gathered to translate and study important scientific, mathematical, and philosophical texts. Discussions about its historical significance have sparked curiosity and deeper thinking. A highlight of the week was World Book Day! The children arrived in fantastic costumes inspired by characters from much-loved novels. It was wonderful to see their enthusiasm for reading as they shared favourite books, took part in storytelling activities, and immersed themselves in the joy of literature.
